





Our Primary students won second prize and the secondary students won special prize in the group singing competition. **Mayank Rane** got special prize for Clap Box held in **Manibhavan**.







- The subject Global Perspectives which was successfully implemented in Checkpoint and IGCSE has been introduced in CP from this year. Global Perspectives helps students develop self-awareness of their own identity, culture, beliefs, and how they connect with the rest of the world.
- We have also introduced STEM education from CPI-V. It will help to develop skills like critical and analytical thinking and creativity, enabling them to think out of the box.
- After successfully implementing life skills in CP IV and V last year, we have introduced this program for CP I,II and III this year to provide opportunities for realising one's potential through practical experience.
- Financial literacy has been introduced this year in IGCSE with the objective to make students aware of managing money and various avenues to do so.







The Alumni Meet on the 9th of August,2023 was a resounding success, offering a platform for students from IGII, A Levels, and IBDP to engage with our ex students who are now exploring colleges and the industry landscape. The teachers also shared their experiences and thoughts to connect with the philosophies.
















On 18th July 2023, Students of AS performed an activity in the classroom on 'Moment of force' using material available in the classroom.






Teachers from both the **English and French** departments came together for a collaborative session in Checkpoint I classes. They talked about French words that are used in English.
