Looking Beyond the Myths of A Levels

One of the most common questions I am asked by parents and students is whether the A Level curriculum is too demanding or too narrow. Having worked closely with A Level learners over the years, I have come to see these concerns not as flaws, but as misunderstandings of what the curriculum truly offers.

A Levels encourage students to study fewer subjects in greater depth, and this depth is transformative. I have watched students move from surface learning to genuine inquiry—questioning assumptions, analysing evidence, and learning to articulate their ideas with clarity and confidence. These are skills that extend far beyond examinations and into real-world decision-making.

Another myth is that A Levels focus only on final assessments. In reality, the journey matters just as much as the outcome. Students learn to manage academic pressure, meet deadlines, respond to feedback, and take responsibility for their learning. Many of our students simultaneously prepare for competitive examinations, and the conceptual rigour of A Levels often strengthens their preparation rather than competing with it.

What stands out to me most is the independence our students develop.

Whether they pursue higher education in India or abroad, our alumni often reflect on how well the A Level experience prepared them for university life and professional expectations. The confidence to think independently and adapt to new challenges is a lasting outcome of this curriculum.

As an A Level Coordinator, it is deeply rewarding to witness students grow into confident, self-directed learners. A Levels are not merely a qualification—they are a preparation for life beyond the classroom.

In contemporary education, academic achievement is often measured by marks and ranks. While performance has its place, the true purpose of education lies in nurturing thinkers — children who question, reason, and understand, rather than merely memorise.

Albert Einstein once stated, “Education is not the learning of facts, but the training of the mind to think.” This insight remains deeply relevant in primary education, where habits of curiosity and critical thinking are first formed. Research in child psychology shows that students who engage in concept-based learning demonstrate stronger problem-solving abilities and retain knowledge longer than those trained only through rote methods.

As a Primary Coordinator, I have witnessed classrooms where a single open-ended question sparks multiple ideas, discussions, and perspectives. In such moments, learning becomes meaningful. A child who explains why an answer is correct shows deeper mastery than one who simply recalls it.

Parents play an equally important role. Encouraging children to ask “how” and “why” at home builds confidence and intellectual independence. Simple conversations during meals or story time can become powerful learning opportunities.

Our aim, therefore, must be to shift from producing toppers to nurturing thinkers. When children are guided to explore, question, and reflect, they develop skills that extend far beyond textbooks. Such learners are better prepared to face real-world challenges with logic, creativity, and compassion.

Fun Flea Esta






Lit-O-Mania – Navarasa

“Speakers' Summit 2024: A Resounding Success!”



“Hindi Language Teaching”



“IBDP - SAIBSA Subject Specific Category 2 Training”






The Chess Tournament organised by Mumbai School's Sports Association saw intense competition, with 259 participants battling for the top spots on 19th October 2024.

Skill Building


"No one is perfect. That's why pencils have erasers."

Cambridge Math-Science Workshop






MISA felicitation
