




#### Yoga - a way of life


#### **Chocolate day celebration**


Van Mahotsav`Bag Free Day' on 1st July, 2022 where the students went paperless for a day.

The **Spell-a-thon** was a inter house competition conducted for our **Checkpoint students.** They



## I Wish My Teacher Knew


"A good education can change anyone. A good teacher can change everything."



creating designs.






# **CLIMATE ACTION AWARD**




